SCHOOL NOTES

(By County Superintendent)
The teachers should make the physical examinations and send in the reports. These are required by law. Bladen held teachers' examinations, November 20. This is the first time they have held the examinations in their town. Miss Goodrich is giving a course in reviews. As a result the students will have a better chance in the teachers' examination than ever before. A little preparation is an immense help in this line. Those schools not carrying a Normal Training class are required to attend some normal school for their eight weeks normal training credit, before they can teach. The Bladen schools seem to be in a flourishing condition despite the fact that their teaching roster was not very complete quite late in the fall.

Teachers that have numbers from other counties that are not used up may use them in this county by giving the number and the name of the county after the number.
The things noticed so far in visiting schools that should be changed are:
More work should be given to the lower grades so that they will be less restless and will improve more. Educational busy work should be planned.
Too many teachers give out lessons without explaining how to get them and this necessitates a lot of interruption through the time of preparation.
Fifty per cent of the complaints against teachers is in the line of government.
It makes trouble to answer questions during class time. It is better to answer questions in between classes. Ten and fifteen minutes is short enough and when half of this is used up in answering outside questions not much is accomplished.
