SCHOOL NOTES

(By County Superintendent)

The Department of Interior advises that all schools have for playground apparatus: 2 playground baseballs; 2 playground base ball bats; 1 pair jumping standards; 1 sand pile, 2 see-saws, 2 swings, 1 turning bar; 1 volley ball, net and posts; 6 bean bags for out door use; 1 "Games for the Playground, Home Schools and Gymnasium" by Miss Bancroft, published by the McMillan Co., N. Y. \$1.50; 1 Bulletin on Physical Education, published by the State Department of Education of Indiana (send 15 cents to Geo. E. Schlafer, University of Indiana, Bloomington, Ind., for a copy.) A larger softer ball is recommended for base ball. With this the rules are the same only the pitcher throws the ball under hand.

Eighth grade examinations this year are April 7th and 8th and May 5th and 6th, 1921.

Clippings from a letter by President E. L. Rouse of the Peru State Normal School:

"Every thoughtful citizen knows that a school with a poor teacher is worse than no school. Listen! More than half of the teachers of this nation, 350,000 of them, are not prepared, according to any reasonable standard, for teaching; viz: two years of professional training beyond the four year high school course."—Claxton.

"The enrollment in the four normal schools in Nebraska should be doubled by a systematic campaign on the part of the superintendents, boards of education, and patrons of the schools. Here and there we hear rumblings that salaries are to be reduced! Go slowly. We cannot afford this. Salaries must be increased rather than decreased. We must attract the people into the profession who will be more or less permanently there. We must learn to weigh values. Some families who are now complaining about high taxes spent more for gas and rubber last year, to say nothing about the first cost of the automobiles, than they did for school taxes.

"The consciousness of democracy," said Dr. Claxton, "has its roots in education. I am not against anything except ignorance. A nation that can spend \$2,100,000,000 for tobacco can afford to pay for education; that is three times as much as is paid to all the teachers in the country. If instead of buying three cigarettes a man would buy two, and instead of smoking three cigars he would smoke two to the nib instead of throwing away the butt, the salaries of teachers could be doubled. There is spent for luxuries in this country more than \$5,000,000,000 or four and a half times more than is paid to teachers of all grades of education.

**NEBRASKA FARM BUREAU
NEWS**

Standing committees of the Nebraska federation as recently named by the executive committee recently are as follows: marketing—Youngs, Gustafson and Dodge; organization—Thompson, Pedrett and Juergens; finance—Briggs, Crocker and Gribble; education—Graham, Crocker and Thompson; legislation—Norton, and Briggs, Gustafson, Graham and Juergens; labor—Pedrett, Gribble and Crocker. The marketing committee was authorized to confer with the state secretary of agriculture in an investigation of the fees charged by the commission men of the Omaha live stock market.

February 28 to March 5 has been named as farm implement inspection and repair week by the Nebraska federation and the college of agriculture. This action was taken by the executive board following the statement of implement manufacturers that the price of machinery would not be reduced during the coming year. The college has two or three bulletins dealing with the care and repair of implements that are available to all farmers who make their wish known.

At a meeting of the Holt county farm bureau at O'Neill last week it was resolved that "Senate File 60 in its present form should not be passed and that the excluding of money from the tangible personal property article 1 section 4 and listing all other taxes is a plain discrimination and in favor of the moneyed interests." The resolution was signed by the committee composed of C. Kirkland, J. W. Pickey and J. B. Fullerton.

Plans have been completed to get a resume of all bills introduced in the Nebraska legislature affecting the farmers, into the hands of the members of the farm bureau each week and then call for a referendum vote. J. N. Norton, former legislator and member of the constitutional convention, chairman of the legislative committee, has been spending a few days each week in Lincoln and is keeping in daily touch with developments through a special representative.

Cheyenne county was one of the first to respond to the request of the American Farm Bureau Federation to donate corn for the Near East Relief. Contributions are now being received at the office of the agricultural agent at Sidney. The state executive committee has endorsed the action of the national federation and will aid in every manner possible.
