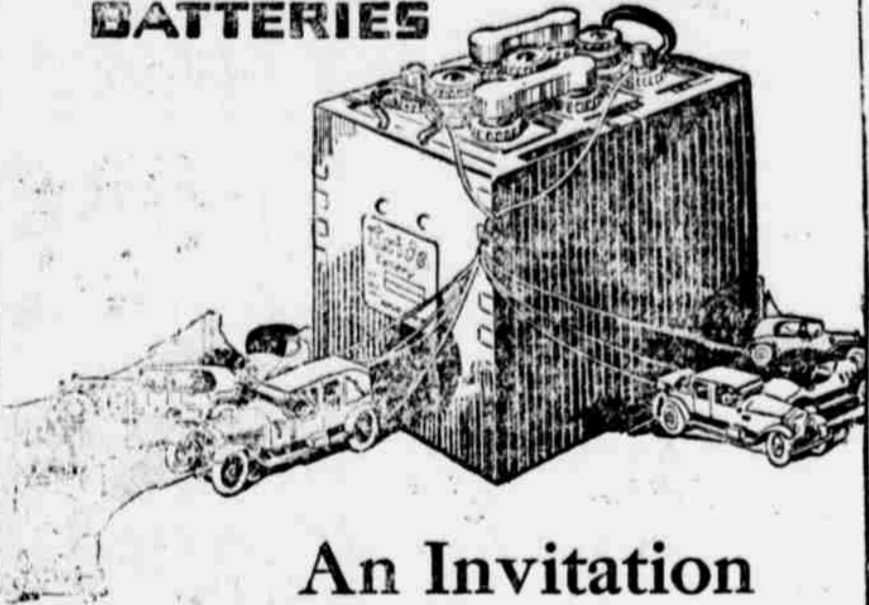

### NEBRASKA FARM BUREAU FEDERATION

H. D. Lute, secretary of the Nebraska Farm Bureau Federation, attended the meeting of the presidents and secretaries of the mid-west group of federations, held at Indianapolis, April 4 and 5. He returned to Chicago Tuesday evening to attend the ratification meeting of the grain marketing Committee of Seventeen, held Wednesday. J. R. Howard, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation and W. G. Eckhardt of the Illinois Agricultural Association, were the principal speakers at the Indianapolis conference.

Elmer E. Youngs of Dawson county, president of the Nebraska Farm Bureau Federation has had marked success during the past few years in growing potatoes under a straw mulch. The main points to remember, according to Mr. Youngs, are: do not pack the ground after planting, use late maturing varieties, plant about May 1, and do not get the straw mulch too deep. Mr. Youngs has secured between 350 and 500 bushels to the acre by this method. A good many of his Dawson county neighbors are having the same success with the mulch.

Over 31,000 members in the Nebraska Farm Bureau Federation is reported by J. N. Norton, member of the executive board and chairman of the organization committee, following the successful campaign in Lincoln county. Mr. Norton stated that the clean-up campaign would be continued indefinitely. Clean-up work has been done during the past few weeks in Butler, Otoe, Saline, Fillmore, Scottsbluff, Merrill and Douglas counties.

Over seventy five sets of government harness have been ordered by Farm Bureau members in the state through the office of H. D. Lute, secretary. This harness is delivered to the individual farmers for \$40.75, plus the carrying charges. Nebraska is not the only state to take up this proposition. Between 200 and 300 sets have been held in Kansas and Missouri reports that orders for 651 sets have been sent out of their office.

J. A. Crawford, former campaign manager in Nebraska, has been one of the principal speakers at the start of the campaigns in Lincoln and Thayer counties. Mr. Crawford has been spending the past two weeks on his large wheat ranch at Bardsley, Kansas. He reports good crop prospects and said that he expected to continue in the Farm Bureau movement in his own state. He is a member of the Kansas board for a term of two years.

Governor S. R. McKelvie of Nebraska approves of the grain marketing plan as proposed by the Committee of Seventeen. In speaking to a conference in Chicago recently he spoke highly of the caliber of the men on the committee. At the invitation of the Nebraska delegates and members of the Committee of Seventeen, the Governor attended the ratification meeting held in Chicago, April 6.

Charles E. Gunnels, assistant secretary and treasurer of the American Farm Bureau Federation, who came to Nebraska recently to assist in bringing the Gift-Corn project to an early close, is a Nebraskan. For several years after graduating from the Nebraska College of Agriculture, he served as county agricultural agent in Seward county. He then became county agent leader in the extension service, and for eight months was director of extension. For a time before entering Farm Bureau Federation work he was assistant chief of the extension service of the department of agriculture.
