Another Fire of Mysterious Origin Destroys Property

This morning about 2:45 o'clock the C. T. Dickenson blacksmith shop on Webster Street was discovered on fire and the alarm was given. The Fire Department and citizens responded quickly, but the blaze must have been assisted as the building was nearly burned down by the time the department arrived.

The building belonged to George Beardslee and Mrs. Wolf of this city and was in good shape, having been erected about twelve years ago.

Mr. Dickenson, who has occupied the building for several years, valued his tools and stock at \$1,000 and carried \$2,500 insurance on the same. He stated that the fire in the forge went out at four o'clock yesterday afternoon and that there had been no fire in the office stove since three o'clock that day. The fall on building just north of the blacksmith shop was being torn down and it was also burned considerably. The fire was undoubtedly of incendiary origin.
