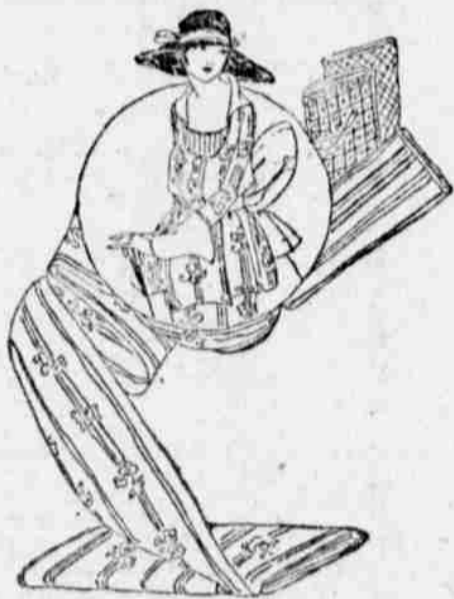

Burlington Reduces Summer Rates West

Announcement was made today at the general offices of the Burlington Railroad that the Burlington, Great Northern and Northern Pacific Railways had decided to make a substantial reduction in summer tourist fares to Colorado, the national parks and other resorts in the Rocky Mountain region.
P. S. Eastis, Passenger Traffic Manager of the Burlington, estimated that the reduction would approximate 20 percent and that it would in effect restore the fares which were effective prior to the big increase made in 1920.
