All entrants must have been residents of Webster, Nuckolls or Franklin counties, Nebraska, or Republic, Jewell or Smith counties, Kansas, for six month period preceding June 28, 1923.

All entrants must be over 15 years of age and play by ear only, no note readers allowed.

Entries will close on June 20th. No entrance fee will be charged to enter contest.

Prizes to be awarded:  
1st—Silver loving cup, given by J. W. Auld and \$10 in cash by Besse Auditorium.

2nd—\$15 in cash.  
3rd—\$7.50 in cash.

The prizes to be awarded by judges selected by Besse Auditorium.

The points upon which the "Fiddlin'" will be judged are:

1st—Time  
Expression  
Clear Fiddling.

Fiddle to be held under chin during playing contest.

Each fiddler to be allowed to select his own tune, the name of which should be sent to the Besse Auditorium one week previous to June 28th.

Each fiddler allowed to choose his own seconder.

### MRS. B. MATILDA GRICE ANSWERS SUMMONS TUESDAY

Death brought to a close the suffering patiently endured, for months past, by Mrs. B. M. Grice, at the home in the Second Ward on Tuesday morning and in her passing the community loses one of its most prominent personages of pioneer days.

B. Matilda Taylor was born in Sullivan county, Indiana, on July 3, 1839. On December 6, 1845, the family moved to Rockwell, Kankakee county, Illinois and on November 24, 1857 at Joliet, Illinois, she was united in marriage to Daniel G. Grice. To this union was born five children—Will, dying in infancy and Fred at the age of 3 years, while his father was in the Civil War service. H. E. Grice, now residing at Arcadia, California, F. J. Grice of this city and Mrs. Mary L. Rutledge of Inavale survive her.

Mrs. Grice is the third of the guests of the Sunset Social held last fall, to pass away. She was the oldest woman present on that occasion, and was one of the earliest settlers of the divide northwest of the city, where with her husband and children she resided for many years. In 1882 she taught school in District 65.

A woman is best known to the public through her husband and children. Her husband served with credit as county supervisor during the period when the county was under township organization. After his death, in 1892, Mrs. Grice, with her two sons, Herbert and "Flave," and daughter, Mary, removed to this city, where the boys became engaged in the drug business.

It is not too much to say that there is no man in Red Cloud who has a larger place in the affections of the people of this neighborhood than her son, "Flave."

At this moment all hearts are touched with sympathy for him who shielded and comforted the last years of his mother's life and gave her all the respect due to a mother and the affection a parent lavishes upon a child.

Her daughter Mrs. John Rutledge, has been a frequent, and at all times, a willing and efficient assistant.

At the age of 10 years Mrs. Grice united with the Methodist church, remaining in this faith until her marriage, at which time she joined her husband in membership with the United Brethren. In the latter years of her life, however, she became a member of the Grace Episcopal church, at which place funeral services will be conducted on tomorrow, Thursday afternoon, at 2:30, after which interment will be made beside her husband in the city cemetery.—Wednesday's Commercial Advertiser.
