### Peter A. Hansen

Peter A. Hansen, who had been in poor health for several years, passed away Friday at the home of his son, P. A. Hansen. He was born in Denmark, September 17, 1844 and was aged 78 years, 8 months, and 28 days.

Mr. Hansen came to America seeking a land of larger opportunity in his youth. On December 13, 1873, at Clinton, Iowa, the Rev. Carl Nelsen officiating, he united in marriage with Miss Mary Jacobsen, also a native of Denmark. To this union were born: one son, P. J. of Red Cloud; and three daughters, Christine, Anna, and Sarah. The three daughters preceded their father to the Great Beyond.

Mr. and Mrs. Hansen came to Red Cloud many years ago where he engaged in the Laundry business which has grown with the town. His wife fell asleep in 1901 since which time he made his home with his son.

Mr. Hansen attended the Danish Lutheran church and was a member of the Odd Fellow's Lodge of Red Cloud.

The funeral services were held at the Christian church of Red Cloud on Monday afternoon, conducted by Rev. C. G. Nelson. The Odd Fellows were out in form and took charge of the service at the grave. The interment being made in the Red Cloud cemetery.
