

Place to Force Cut in Commission Rates

Washington, June 23—(Special Telegram)—Secretary Wallace of the Department of Agriculture, has undertaken to force a reduction in commissions charged in livestock centers. It is claimed by department officials that commission rates were boosted during the war, and that cattle prices have gone down.

It was believed that after a conference between Secretary Wallace and the commission representatives a voluntary reduction would be made. This has not been done and the secretary has just held another conference. He still expects a voluntary reduction.

In the meantime, department representatives are making investigations of commission charges in Omaha, St. Joseph, Sioux City, Fort Worth, Portland and South St. Paul.

On the basis of these investigations, which are to determine facts concerning a general situation, the secretary will order a hearing for the purpose of preparing the way to order a reduction, in case a voluntary one is not made.

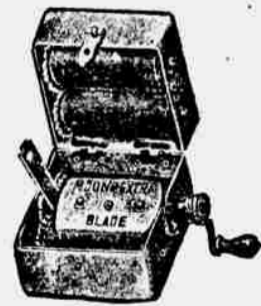

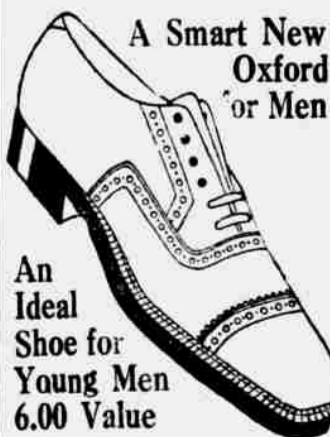

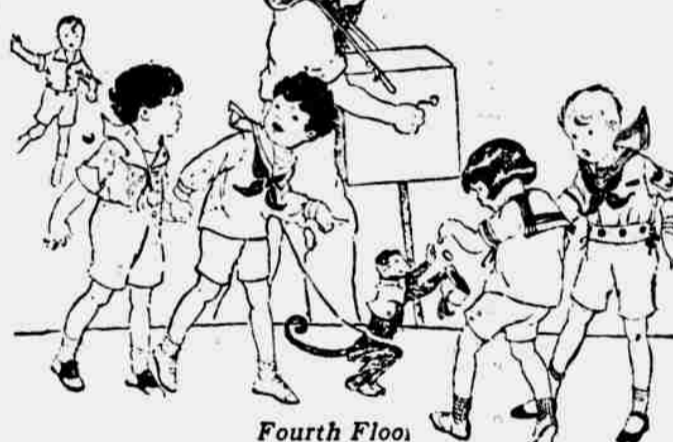
