The op-ponent's movements will be antici-pated and the quick thinker will be in a position to block the best offense offered by an opponent. Many Striking Examples.



Not only will the White Sox receiver think and act quickly, but he generally outguesses or anticipates the movements of the men on the runways. 
Switzerland Boasts Three Golf Courses on Alps
