## ELECTRICITY-"THE IDEAL SERVANT" Dear Jane: No, indeed, we shall not leave the farm now that I have 30 efficient servants, even though my accident did

leave me a semi-invalid.

Electricity has taken all the dirty, back-breaking drudgery out of farm life. Best of all, it makes possible a real home life, the privacy of which is not sacrificed to hired help.

The electric thermostat has my house cozy and warm at rising time, and tends furnace all day. The percolator, waffle iron and grill cook breakfast right at the table, so I get an extra hour's rest in the morning.

The dishwasher does that most disagreeable of tasks; and the vacuum cleaner has freed me from that "knock-down,anddrag-out" process called housecleaning.

Electricity manufactures clean ice right in the refrigerator, it forces soft water through the house by an automatic pump. and it heats water instantaneously by the mere turn of the faucet.

Its greatest service is in the laundry. Think of washing clothes without even getting one's hands wet! I do. My machine partly dries them, then I run them through the ironer and finish off with the iron.

Baby enjoys his electric comforts, too-the heater to take the chill off the bathroom, the immersion heater to warm his milk, the heating pad at his feet or "tummy," or the fan on hot days. I use the heater for a hair dryer, also, then wave my hair with the electric curler.

In the kitchen, the electric range with oven control saves so much dirt and work. Then the food chopper, bread mixer, cake mixer, egg or cream whipper, buffer, sharpener, churn and separator are all run by motor.

The sewing machine motor is a great money saver. I can use better materials than in readymade garments, and can utilize "make-overs." The vibrator massages the stiffness from my lame joints; but the 100-watt lamp is our real doctor. A physician used this as a remedy for pleurisy. and it is equally good for any pain or soreness. Rub the place with a penetrating ointment, and then apply the 100-watt lamp. Relief is immediate.

Add to this list of service, the cultural value of good music (our machine has an electric motor for winding) and good reading made possible by electric lamps, and


