Threshing of winter wheat is more than half finished in the southeastern quarter, says the government weekly weather crop report. In Nebraska threshing and stacking is progressing well, oats are being cut in western counties, spring wheat harvesting is under way in Minnesota and the Dakotas and some threshing has been done in South Dakota. Late sown wheat has been damaged in North Dakota. Minnesota needs rain. The lowa weekly weather report says harvesting is practically completed, except in the northern third of the state.

Van Dusen Harrington's crop report says some early wheat in the northern half of spring wheat section is ripe. Many fields have taken on a golden color, indicating a different condition from the wheat crops of the past four or five years. Black rust has almost ceased to be a factor in South Dakota and southern Minnesota. Considerable black rust in Red river valley and some wheat may be shrunken. Condition of flax is very satisfactory.

A diversity of opinion exists as to effect of the settlement of the coal and railroad strike. Some grain men claim that it will benefit by furnishing more cars to grain shippers in the interior and enlarge the in and outward movement, as exporters will be able to do more business under increased offerings. Other argue that enlarged receipts will have a depressing influence on values and that the trend of all grain prices is lower.

A Kansas City message says country elevators report that farmers are delivering wheat as fast as possible, and receipts will be only limited by the number of cars available. Wichita had 166 cars and Kansas City S29 cars.
