

Women Delegates to G. O. P. County Convention Meet

Pass Motion Asking Representation at State Convention on Basis of Strength at County Confab.

Women who were elected as delegates to the republican county convention and as precinct committee women, met yesterday afternoon in the city council chamber to discuss their prospective duties, under the leadership of Mrs. Draper Smith, vice chairman of the republican county central committee.

A short and snappy discussion arose over the question of whether the women should ask for representation at the republican state convention on the basis of their voting strength as reflected at the polls, or on a basis of their representation at the county convention next Thursday afternoon.

Discuss Representation. Mrs. E. G. McKilton, backed by

Mrs. John Kilmartin, put through a motion that women should ask for state convention representation according to their strength at the county convention, which bears the relation of four women to five men.

Mrs. Pearl R. Brady of the Eighth ward opened the discussion with the suggestion that women should ask for representation based on their recorded voting strength.

"We should not ask the men to give us something we are not entitled to," said Mrs. Brady.

Mrs. Brady's idea was favored by Mrs. Isabelle E. Lindquist who said: "The franchise has been extended to the women who must work for what they get and are entitled to."

Does Husband's Work. Mrs. Kilmartin was of the opinion that it was up to the women to make themselves seen and heard in politics. She explained that in her precinct of the Ninth ward her husband was a republican precinct committee man, but let all of the work to her. Some of the women believed Mrs. Kilmartin was not alone in her experience.

"No matter what you may decide on this afternoon you will find the men of the county convention very generous," vouchsafed Mrs. Smith.
