Big South America-Bound Air Cruiser in Flight. New York, Aug. 17.—Pointing the nose of Sampaio Correia seaward, Lieut. Walter Hinton, U. S. N. P. F., took off from the waters of Jamaica bay at 7:20 o'clock this morning and started to put behind him the 600 miles to Charleston, S. C., the first hop in the 8,500-mile flight from New York to Rio Janeiro. The crew, five in all, was beside Hinton, J. Vascoco, pilot; John W. Whisen, mechanic; C. J.
