

Small Classes Are Successful

School of Individual Instruction Seeks Out Mental Tendencies in Pupils.

The school of individual instruction, founded about two years ago by Mrs. C. F. Pratt, a public school teacher from Massachusetts, now stands as the only institution of its type west of New York.

The school of individual instruction, said Mrs. Pratt, "has been developed along original lines. My public school teaching experience finally brought me to the conclusion that teaching children in large classes was far from satisfactory. The school aims to develop the finest mental tendencies in children. I found that this could be done by keeping the school small, by teaching classes not larger than 10 and by individual attention."

"Our plan is this: After the student has passed a physical and psychological test, which is given to determine how much work he or she can accomplish, we assign courses to fit their needs. If a student is very able in mathematics and slow in languages he is given fewer hours in mathematics and heavier work in languages. The student is also assigned to classes which contain other students of his same ability."

The school recently acquired the building across the street from 3807 Harney street, which will house the primary and intermediate department until such a time when the school can locate in one building.

Prof. Foote has served many years on the staff of the medical and dental schools and has attained a national reputation as an authority on the comparative histology of the bone.
