Model Farm TourRural Life at Its Best to Be
Revealed to Big Caravan
That Leaves on
Trip Today.

Nebraska farm life at its best will be revealed today on a tour of Douglas county model farms arranged by E. G. Maxwell, county farm agent, and sponsored by the Omaha Chamber of Commerce.

Twelve hundred persons, including leaders from both town and country, are expected to wend their way in the caravan from farm to farm.

Feature educational demonstrations on the trip will be as follows:

At H. E. Gaines' farm, three miles north of Elkhorn, brush dam.

Erosion Control at Graus.

At Charles Graus' farm, one mile north of Bennington, soil erosion control.

At Wayland McGee's Summerhill farm, three and a half miles west of Bennington, where luncheon will be served, farm lighting and presentation of cost figures.

At W. J. Bollinger's farm, two

miles north of Irvington, improved hog houses.

At Henry Stoltenberg's farm, three and a half miles northeast of Irvington, last stop, radio telephony, by Ivan D. Wood of the agricultural engineering department of the University of Nebraska.
