## Packers Drop Pair of Games to Buffaloes

Dan Tipple Hurls Herd to First Victory, 7 to 6, While "Lefty" Hyman Cops Second, 13 to 7.

PLAYING before more than 3,800 fans and fannettes and quite a large gathering of the latter, the Omaha Buffaloes yesterday afternoon knocked the Sioux City Packers for a double victory in a Labor day attraction, winning the first game, 7 to 6, and the second affair, 13 to 7.

Enough hits were banged out in each game to last both clubs for the remainder of the week, a total of 45 hits being clouted out during the afternoon's exhibition of the national pastime. Of the 45 hits, the Buffaloes collected an even dozen in the first and 15 in the second, while the packers nicked Omaha pitchers for 29, nine in the opener and the remainder in the grand finale.

By virtue of their twin victory the Buffaloes forged ahead of the Packers in the standings. This morning the herd is camping in fourth place in the race, having moved up from fifth to fourth position within the last 24 hours.

**Tipple on Mound.**  
The veteran Dan Tipple struck out as many Packers in his first game as he allowed hits. Nine being the number of Iowans whiffed by said Tipple. Daniel sort of relaxed in the ninth inning and as a result the visitors started a rally that pretty nearly ruined Tipple's game.

With the Buffaloes leading 7 to 3, at the start of the ninth, "Chick" Mattick's hired hands opened up a new brand of fireworks that didn't finish poppin' until they had scored three runs.
