Bankers Announce Plan to Readjust **Debts of Mexico**

Proposal by International Committee Provides Resumption of Interest in Default Since 1913.

I will section of the international committee of bankers of Mexico made public a summary of the plan of readjusting Mexico's external debt of \$700,000,000 which was included in their agreement last June, with Finance Minister de La Huerta. Simultaneously the plan, which pro-Ask your physician to try thyroid vides for a resumption of interest payments, in default since 1913, was given out in London, Paris, Mexico City and Berlin.

After listing the bonds and other obligations of the government and the National Railways of Mexico, which, under the program are to be returned to private management, the bankers recommended certain concessions to the security holders.

In view of these concessions, the Mexican government will set aside during the next five years, 50,000,000 pesos (\$25,000,000 gold United States dollars), so as to resume at the end of that period, full cash service on its obligations. If for any reason, the proposed plan is not fully carried out, the bondholders are to resume their contractual rights as existing prior to that time,

To meet the bond coupons matur-ing after January 2, 1923, the Mexican government will place in a spe-cial fund, the entire proceeds of the oil export tax, 10 per cent of the gross revenues of the National railways and the entire net operating revenues of these railways. 

Parents' Problems

How can a baby best be cured o putting things into its mouth?

The act is at first instinctive, caused by the irritation of the coming teeth. Minimize biting from three months until 7 by giving the child but one plaything—a raitle so sus-pended that he can just reach it and knock it about with his tiny hands. This is a lesson in muscle control, it interests the baby and prevents the formation of the habit of putting things in his mouth by keeping his hands out of his mouth. At seven months give him a very large, very light rattle to hold, and suspend a very large ball where he can strike at it. When he is 10 months old, add to his toys a large rag doll. These are all the toys he will need until he is a year old, when hollow cubes or blocks may be given him.
