Special Agent of Belt
Railway Is Murdered

Chicago, Sept. 17.—Three men today murdered A. L. Lang, a special agent of the Belt railway. Two of the men were armed with shotguns and Lang had shot down without warning. He had been especially active in discovering and preventing plotters to wreck trains and destroy rail property and had been warned several days ago that he had incurred the enmity of the strikers. This was the outstanding act of violence during the day, although there were some slippings, a few houses at walkouts were stoned and the children of men at work were driven from the street by "educational crowds" of the strikers. Matters were unusually quiet at points outside of Chicago.

Paris, Sept. 18.—"Tell Jack Dempsey he's my next meat," was the message the Chicago Tribune today was asked to convey to the champion from Battling Siki, a young Sengalese, who fights Georges Carpentier in Paris next Sunday.

"I'm going to knock out Georges in the first round and then go straight to America, and camp on Dempsey's trail," continued Siki, who has knocked out many of the best men in Europe, but has never been knocked down himself. Nobody in Paris, except Siki himself, thinks he has a chance against Carpentier.

Drivers Injured
in Kansas City
Race to Recover

Kansas City, Mo., Sept. 18.—Reports from hospitals today indicated that three motor car drivers injured seriously yesterday in the dedication race of Kansas City's new half-million dollar speedway, would recover.

Roscoe S. Searles of Lafayette, Ind., was killed when his car's steering knuckle broke and the machine plunged off the top of the speedway, bursting into flames after it had struck the ground 25 feet below.

Eight men were injured in a series of accidents, but of the number Christopher V. Pickup, Los Angeles, mechanician for Searles; Ed Hefferman, Chicago, mechanician for Eddie Hearne, and Harry Henning of Independence, Mo., mechanician for Pete de Paolo, suffered the most serious injuries. They sustained concussion of the brain by cuts and bruises. They also may be injured internally, physicians said.

The less seriously injured include Hearne, De Paolo, Joe DeThomas and Jimmie Murphy. The others were cut and bruised. Murphy did not go to a hospital. Raymond Curley of Santa Monica, mechanician, was slightly bruised.

The race was won by Tommy Milton of St. Paul, who covered the 300 miles in 2:46:52.9. Harry Haritz was second; Frank Elliott, third; Ralph Mulford, fourth; and Jerry Wonderlick, fifth.

Roscoe Searles
Planned to Quit
Motor Racing Game

Kansas City, Sept. 18.—"After today I am through with the game," So spoke Searles to a friend just before he took the wheel in today's race. Searles said his wife, who is in the east, had begged him to quit motor racing and he had decided to accede to her wishes. Searles and Cliff Durant of Los Angeles were to have driven two cars of the same make in the race. The second car did not arrive in time for the start and Durant yielded his car to Searles, who was his close friend.
