The accomplishments of the congress were tersely told in the senate yesterday by Senator Smoot of Utah, than whom there is no closer student of financial affairs in congress. The tariff itself, which is the most comprehensive piece of legislation enacted by the congress, gives the farmer the best of it as no other tariff bill has ever done. One of the accomplishments of the administraion was omitted by Senator Smoot. It is that liberty bonds have been brought back to par. Senator Smoot's summary follows:






