Husker Students Sell 2,700 Athletic Tickets

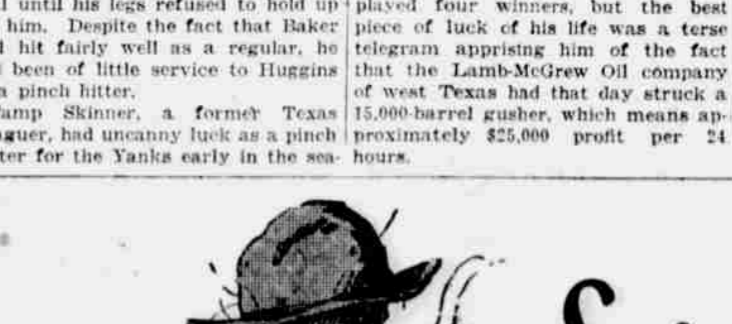
