Foot Ball Facts Worth Knowing

Q. What is clipping? What is the penalty for it?

A. Clipping is throwing the leg from behind across the legs or leg (below the knee) of a player not carrying the ball. This, however, does not apply to close line play. Loss of 15 yards from spot where ball was put in play. Rule 21, section 3.
