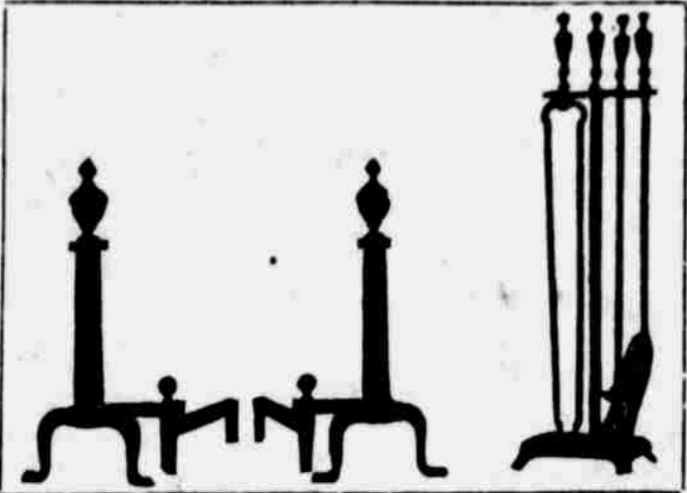

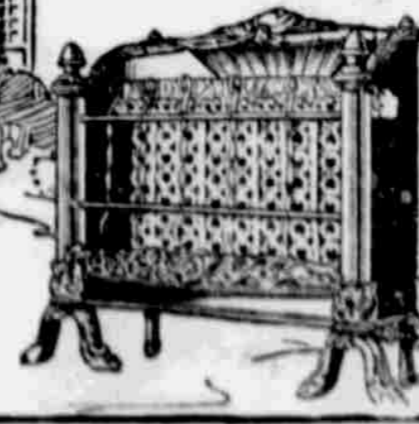

"Dingle Dust" Suspect Is Given Clean Bill

Marion, Ga., Sept. 28.—Mason's Dinktown is at rest once more. Where four and trembling stilled because of belief that witchcraft was in its midst and families and friends were arrayed against each other, harmony now reigns.

It has been judicially decided that Norman Rakestraw, alleged conjurer and sprinkler of "dingle dust," a witching powder that makes persons on whom it is thrown writhe and die in agony, is only a stammered individual.

Incidentally, in giving Norman a clean bill of health that will again open the doors of Dinktown society to him, the court decreed that Hays Peterson, negro, must pay Rakestraw \$500 for damaging his character.

Several weeks ago Rakestraw filed a suit for that amount, alleging that he had lost his social standing among his colored friends because of circulation of the "dingle dust" stories about him by Peterson.
