This picture will appear frequently in this paper until October 18, when the contest will close. But don't wait to send in your list. Get it in early.

It is not a subscription contest and you do not have to send in a single subscription to win a prize. If the judges award you first prize and you have sent in one bona-fide new three-month order for the Morning and Sunday Bee or the Evening and Sunday Bee either in Omaha, Council Bluffs or any town outside Omaha or Council Bluffs where The Omaha Bee has carrier delivery service; or one bona-fide new six-month paid-in-advance subscription by mail you will receive \$500 instead of \$20, second prize \$250, etc. (See second column of figures in prize list.)

Isn't this a fine offer? It only takes two bona-fide new three-month subscriptions by carrier or two bona-fide new six-month subscriptions by mail to qualify for the big \$1,000 award. A new subscription is one for a person who was not taking The Omaha Bee on September 12, 1922.

You do not need to send any money with a subscription to be delivered by carrier. The carrier boy will attend to the collecting. Mail subscriptions must be accompanied by a remittance for \$2.50 for each six-month subscription sent in, as all mail subscriptions are payable in advance.

Send in your subscriptions as soon as you get them, whether your "B" list is ready or not. Remember, the subscriber wants the paper to start right away and might cancel your order unless you turn it in promptly.

### OBSERVE THESE RULES

1. Any woman, boy or girl, who is not an employe of The Omaha Bee or a member of an employe's family, may submit an answer. It costs nothing to try.
2. All answers must be mailed by October 18, 1922, and sent to The Omaha Bee.
3. All lists of names should be written on one side of the paper only and numbered consecutively 1, 2, 3, etc. Write your full name and address on each page in the upper right-hand corner. Do not write subscriber's name or anything else on the same paper with list of words; use separate sheet.
4. Only words found in the Webster's Unabridged Dictionary will be counted. Do not use obsolete words. Use either the singular or plural, but where the plural is used the singular cannot be counted, and vice versa. Do not use hyphenated or compound words, or any word formed by the combination of two or more complete English words, where each word in itself is a separate object. When an object can be correctly called by two or more names, any one of such names will be counted as a word.
- Note--Explanation of third sentence in Rule 4. Do not use a hyphenated word which is formed of two or more complete English words, where each word in itself is a separate object in the picture. Do not use any word which is formed of two or more complete English words, where each word in itself is a separate object in the picture.
5. Words of the same spelling can be used only once, even though used to designate different objects. An object can be named only once; however, any part of the object may also be named.
6. In making the awards each list will be considered solely upon its merits. Each incorrect word counts against the contestant just as much as a correct word counts in the contestant's favor. Therefore, it is very important that no incorrect words are included in a list.
7. The answer having the largest number of words which correctly name objects shown on the picture which begin with the letter "B," deduction to be made for incorrect words, will be awarded first prize.
8. Candidates may cooperate in answering the puzzle, but only one prize will be awarded to any one household; nor will prizes be awarded to more than one of any group outside of the family where two or more have been working together.
9. In the event of a tie for any prize offered, the full amount of such prize will be paid to each tied party.
10. All answers will receive the same consideration regardless of whether or not subscriptions for The Omaha Bee are sent in.
11. Three business men of this city, having an connection with The Omaha Bee, will be selected to act as judges and decide the winners. They will use Webster's Unabridged Dictionary as reference and participate agree to accept the decision of the judges as final and conclusive.
12. The judges will meet directly following close of the contest and announcement and the list of words winning first prize will be published in The Omaha Bee just as quickly thereafter as possible.
