

Nebraska Radio Station Opens With Program

State Marketing Bureau Will Furnish Agricultural Information by Ether Waves.

Lincoln, Oct. 6.—(Special)—The new radio reporting station of the bureau of markets, state department of agriculture, will be officially opened Monday night, October 9, to the people of Nebraska, when a special program will be broadcast.

The program will consist of a series of short talks by prominent men on timely topics relating to agricultural matters. Governor McKelvie will give the opening talk. The other speakers will follow at 15-minute intervals.

The new station at the capitol building has been supplemented very highly by many different sources from the colleges and departments with which its program is received, as well as from the various radio stations. Over 250 programs have been received.

The program will be broadcast as follows: Address by S. R. McKelvie, governor of Nebraska, "The Farmer's Marketing Problems"; Geo. E. Johnson, secretary, department of public works, "Radio Development"; E. A. Burnett, dean, Nebraska college of agriculture, "Agricultural Extension Service of the University of Nebraska"; H. D. Lute, secretary, Nebraska Farm Bureau Federation, "Value of Market Reports to Farmer Organizations"; Leo Stahr, secretary, Nebraska department of agriculture, "Service Rendered by the State Department of Agriculture."
