New York Oct. 7.—The action of today's various markets was to be judged according to the relation of the various movements to important aspects of the general situation, the renewed advance in interest, the strength of what prices would be first in sterling. Another market touched the high level of the week, but sterling ended the week with a 1/4% rise for the week and, selling 3/4% a bushel above the price of barley three weeks ago and measurably above the day preceding, indicated the presence of other forces than the war talk.

Changes Equally Divided. Nothing came to light by way of tenders in today's stock market except reports of the pressmen holding up and holding down of speculative stocks by professional speculators. The market was not changed by these reports, but the changes were about equally divided between advances and declines. The more interesting comparison is with the final price of a week ago. The uniform and in many cases emphatic advance in prices of the various commodities, especially in the case of the wheat, is the most striking feature of the market.

Average Higher. The London commodity market, published today, was interesting chiefly as showing the average movement of such prices in England and to this country. On our own average it has been rising slowly, and practically without interruption for 16 months. It is now nearly 15 per cent above the low point reached in June of 1921.
