

Two Omaha High School Elevens Will Play Today---Central Battles Here

South Meets Lincoln Team on Latter's Field

Many Important Contests Scheduled for State-- Kearney Plays at Lexington.

Two Omaha high school football elevens, South and Central, will battle on the gridiron this afternoon. Coach Patton's South Side Packers journey to Lincoln this morning where they mingle with coach Dow's athletes in the afternoon, while Central and Sioux City high tangle on the Buffaloes' baseball lot this afternoon.

Nearly all the outstate high machines will roll on the field today. Many important pickup struggles are on the schedule, to say nothing of the intercity contests that are sure to attract much interest among the outstate fans.

South High Crippled.
Coach Patton of South High is taking a crippled team to Lincoln. The Packers are minus the services of Captain Herb Spencer, fullback and one of the best high school line plungers in the state. Quarterback Russell Graham, while he may get into the conflict, has been nursing an injured side and cannot be expected to play much of a game. Two or three other packers have been on the injured list this week, but may be able to play this afternoon. Merrill, back field line man, is on the injured list and will be out of the lineup.

A little comparison of South and Lincoln can be gathered from the scores each team made against Fremont high. Lincoln won from Fremont, 6 to 6, while South lost, 28 to 2. South entered the Fremont game minus seven regulars. Three of those veterans are expected to play this afternoon.

Coach Schmidt of Central has ironed the wrinkles out of his squad and is ready to send them against Sioux City at Leavenworth this afternoon. A week of hard scrimmages with the University of Omaha has improved the team until Schmidt believes his men will trounce the Iowans.

The Central reserves will play a preliminary game to the Central-Sioux City contest, this game starting at 4 o'clock.

Kearney at Lexington.
Out in the state the Kearney-Lexington contest at Lexington is attracting a lot of interest. Lexington last week eliminated North Platte, 1921 state champions, from the 1922 race.

In meeting Kearney, Lexington will back up against a scrappy eleven, one which is composed of a speedy backfield and a heavy line.

The Alliance football game today on the latter's gridiron should be a game worth watching. Both teams boast fast backfields and strong lines. Considerable rivalry exists between these two schools.
