

G. O. P. Senator's Speech Here to Be First Since 1912

Illinois Solon One of Few to Make Self Heard in Upper House While New Member.

When Modell McCormick speaks at Hotel Rome next Thursday evening, it will be his first appearance in Nebraska since 1912.

In 1912, McCormick spoke at Lincoln in behalf of Theodore Roosevelt, then a candidate for Nebraska's vote for president, in the state's first presidential primary. This year, he comes as a senator of the United States and as chairman of the republican senatorial committee.

McCormick was elected to the senate from Illinois in 1913, after a single term in the lower house of congress. He is one of the living examples of men who have not observed the senatorial tradition that members are made to be seen and not heard, who have defied it and lived to tell the tale.

McCormick became an active senator from the day he was sworn in. First of all, he championed a national budget and within three years he saw it a law, hailed everywhere as the treasury's one salvation in a time which called for rigid economy. The result of this legislation and its operation is thus summed up by Senator McCormick:

Elmer E. Milligan of Mount Morris, N. Y., defeated R. J. Fogg, incumbent, for grand secretary.

F. J. Joesel led the faction that opposed Grable for his action in averting a walkout of the approximately 400,000 members of the brotherhood during the railroad strike and his victory was hailed by his supporters as approval of the "conservative" policy sponsored by Grable.
