

Omaha Legion Members Leave for New Orleans

"Cornhusker" Special Bears Delegation to Convention—Stops to Be Made at Historic Points.

Omaha delegation bound for the New Orleans American Legion convention, 40 strong, left last night at 11.10 on the "Cornhusker" special from Burlington station. Two standard and two tourist Pullmans were attached to the regular train to St. Joseph, where cars from Lincoln will be added and the special made up. The special will carry about 200 persons in all.

A stop of five hours will be made at St. Louis to allow the legionnaires to see the city. A second stop will be made at Clinton for a visit to the historical battlefield of Shiloh, with possibly a third at Lodi, Gen. Parshley's birthplace. From St. Louis the route will be over the Mobile & Ohio to Meridian, Miss., and the Orleans & Northwestern to New Orleans.

The train will reach New Orleans at 7 Monday morning. On the return, the train will leave Friday evening, October 20, at 8, arriving in Omaha Sunday afternoon.

Official State Cap.
An official state cap, authorized by the last state convention, will distinguish the Nebraska visitors. Arm bands are being furnished by the Omaha Chamber of Commerce.

Several women are in the party. Mrs. Frank Kennedy, Miss Margaret Kennedy, Miss Vera Husted and Allen Kennedy plan to go on to Cuba following the convention. Omaha delegates are Clinton Bromer and Harry C. Hough, H. E. Johnson of Valley also will represent the second district. Alternates are N. G. Noyes, Blair; E. E. McKnight, Omaha; and Vincent Lowry, South Omaha. Mrs. John Kilmarin is delegate for the second district to the Legionauxiliary. John Pappas, John Kilmarin and Wright Cochran are delegates from local veterans No. 26, 49, Hommes and 5 Chevoux.

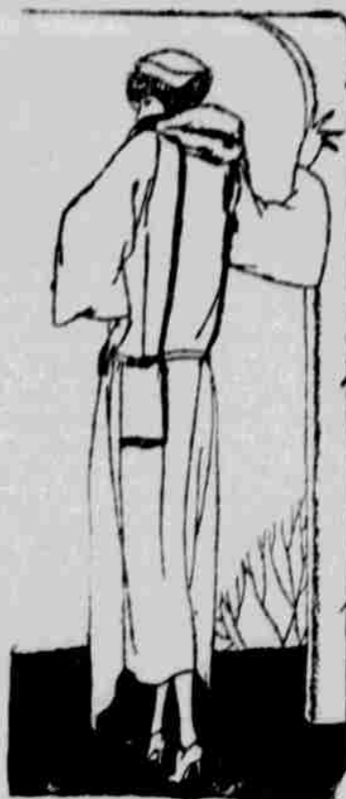
