You my that it is not a touchdown and that Rule 7, Section 2, provides for just an emergency. I can't find anything in this rule covering that point. Are

you not wrong? Isn't such a play ruled a touchdown? A. Rule 7, Section 3, third para-graph, states that if the ball has been fumbled behind the goal line and then rolls outside that it may be recovered for a touchdown. Also, Rule 6, Sec-

tion 13 (b) covers the case. Q. An onside player, that is, one who was behind the punter when he kicked the ball, runs down the field and is the first man to try to secure the ball. He touches it as it is rolling over goal line. Can he recover

it for a touchdown? Can any of the players on his team recover it for a touchdown? Just what is the decision A. An onside kick must be recovered




