Reception for Team Which Beat Yale Outclassed Armistice Day Celebration Four Years Ago.

Iowa City, Oct. 16.—(By A. P.)—Iowa's victorious football team was given a reception upon its arrival here at 4:30 today from New Haven, where it defeated Yale, 4 to 0, that outlasted the demonstration which greeted the armistice announcement four years ago.

The medical school, considered the most conservative of all the colleges on the university campus, led the demonstration, which threatened to demoralize classes throughout the day.

Heroes Sneak Away. The playing of hands and the blowing of whistles started at 4 and continued for five hours, combined with yells and cries of Iowa's victory.

Football Facts Worth Knowing

Q. Your fourth question published September 12, asks if a touchdown may be scored by team kicking off if one of its players recovers the ball after it has crossed the side line extended beyond the goal line.

A. Rule 7, Section 2, third paragraph, states that if the ball has been fumbled behind the goal line and then rolls outside that it may be recovered for a touchdown. Also, Rule 6, Section 13 (b) covers the case of one of his teammates fall on it over goal line.
