

Alleged Communists Waive Examination

St. Joseph, Mich., Oct. 18.—Twenty alleged communists, arrested August 27, when federal and state authorities raided the convention of the communist party of America in the sand-

hills 23 miles south of here, today waived examination and were bound over to the circuit court for trial November 27.

Twelve of the twenty gave new bonds in the sum of \$10,000 each and the other eight went back to jail. Before going, however, they filed with Judge Ray Davis a petition for a reduction in bond. Circuit Judge Charles

White will hear the motion Monday.

The government had a dozen witnesses on hand, including deputy sheriffs and Department of Justice agents, who made the raid, but the action of the defendants waiving the preliminary examination made it unnecessary to reveal the details of the government's case.

Unions File Motion to Vacate Injunction

Chicago, Oct. 18.—By A. P. Notes of a motion to dissolve interlocutory injunction restraining striking railroad shopmen and union officials from interfering in any way with rail

transportation, was served on the United States district attorney by Donald H. Richberg, counsel for the shopmen. The motion will be presented to Federal Judge H. Wilcox Thursday with request that it be set for hearing.

One of the principal objections to the injunction is that "The conditions described in the bill of complaint, if

they ever existed, no longer exist."

It is claimed that a large portion of the railroads involved have settled their differences with the shopmen and that the settlements automatically disposed of the grievances alleged.

Lawrence fell head first into a waste receptacle while playing in the

kitchen, his mother being outside at the time. The cries of Elmer attracted Mrs. Strocker, who rushed into the house and found her infant son's head submerged in liquid. The child had stopped breathing. A physician gave directions over the telephone for first aid. It was 20 minutes before the infant was revived. He will recover.
