

Nebraska Winter Wheat Suffering From Bad Drouth

Summary of State Crop Conditions Says Situation Worse Than Year Ago—Car Shortage Increasing.

Lincoln, Oct. 18.—The severe drouth remains unbroken over 75 per cent of the winter wheat belt. The husking of corn has started and harvest of sugar beets, potatoes and apples continues, according to the semi-monthly summary of crop conditions for Nebraska made public today by A. E. Anderson of the division of crop and livestock statistics and the Nebraska department of agriculture.

Car shortage is increasing, the report states, but an encouraging sign is noted in the increased shipments into the state of feeder stock cattle, which, Mr. Anderson says, have more than doubled this year. The full text of the report follows:

Worse Than Last Year.

The wheat situation over 75 per cent of the winter wheat belt is very unfavorable, due to continued drouth. Conditions are worse than a year ago at this time when they also were unfavorable in about half of the winter wheat area. About 52 per cent of the wheat crop was shipped previous to October 1.

The husking of corn has started. There is a good demand for corn buyers at 3 1/2 to 4 cents per bushel and board, but the labor supply appears to be short. Judging by the size of the spring crop and the large receipts of stock and feeder cattle, the percentage of the crop to be shipped out will be considerably lower than usual.

Big Potato Crop.

The October potato crop offered but little encouragement to growers. The total crop of the country was placed at 433,000,000 bushels, as compared with the five-year average of 313,000,000 bushels. The Nebraska estimate was reduced slightly over 1,000,000 bushels, due to the poor returns from late planting in western Nebraska, but the commercial surplus still is considerable more than that of last year. Prices still are very low, mostly from 49 to 59 cents per hundred pounds for early Ohio.

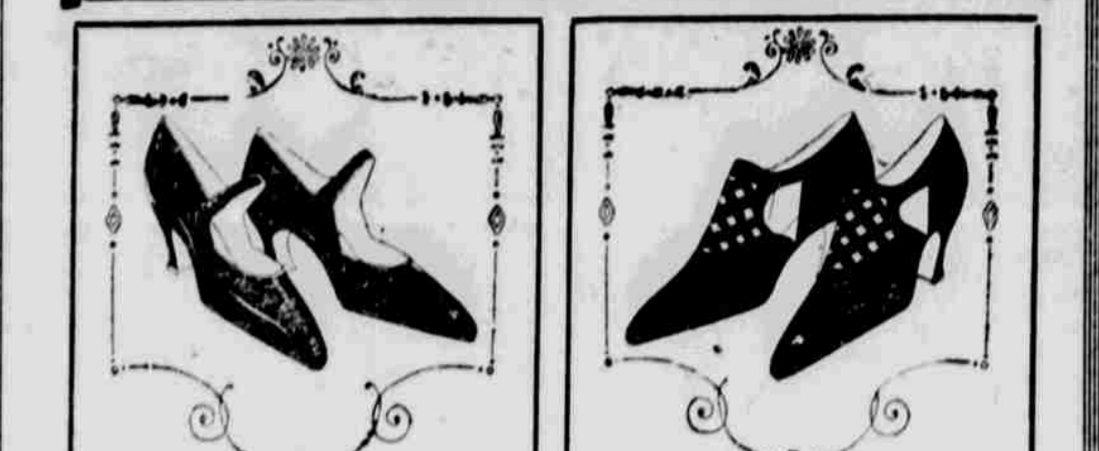

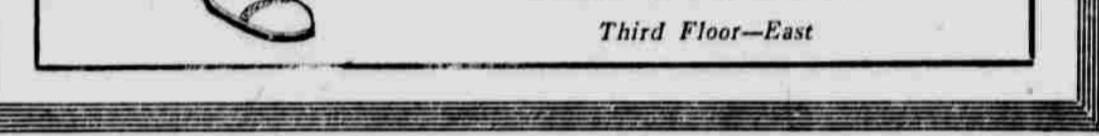

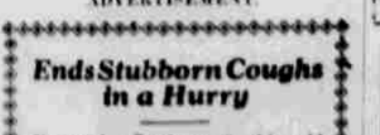
