

Records Show Bryan Opposed Rate Reduction

Minutes of Council Meeting Refute Claims Made by "Brother Charley" of Aiding Taxpayers.

Lincoln, Oct. 20.—Special Telegram.—Not only did C. W. Bryan vote against the stipulation of settlement between the city of Lincoln and the Lincoln gas company, which meant something like \$400,000 in cash rebates to the consumer, but he once cast his vote against a proposed reduced municipal lighting scale. In both of these instances, he stood alone.

On September 29, 1921, Commissioner Schroeder, head of the municipal light and water department, submitted to the council a resolution fixing the following new rate schedule. On all service a fixed charge of 40 cents per month, five cents per k. w. h. for the first 10 k. w. h., four cents for the next 20 k. w. h., three and one-half cents for the next 400 k. w. h., and three cents for all current consumed over 500 k. w. h.

Golden Feather Mine Is Reopened in Black Hills

Lead, S. D., Oct. 20.—(Special).—An important event in Black Hills mining circles this week was the re-opening of active mining at the Golden Feather mine in Two Butte gulch.
