About the Elk

The elk in this country are primarily found in the mountains of northwestern Wyoming and in Yellowstone National park. They travel in herds of from 30 to 40 and occasionally in herds of several hundred.

In the summer time they seek the high places of the mountains to get away from the flies and mosquitos. When snowstorms come in the fall they form in large herds and drift to the lower country. The reason for this is that the grass in the mountains becomes so filled with snow that they are not able to travel around and get food.

Several years ago the elk used to go down to the prairie lands, where they found lots of open range for winter feed. Since the prairie country has been settled by farmers the elk has been forced to hunt new pastures.

Thousands drift each year to south of Yellowstone park into what is known as Jackson Hole. The farmers in this vicinity raise large quantities of hay which the government purchases from them to feed the elk.

In the fall the cows, calves and bulls go to the same herd and in December the bulls calves stay with their mothers or in the same herd with their mothers until they are about 2 years old. Some stay until they are 3 years old. When the calves are a year old they start growing horns, which appear first as spikes with 70 branches. A remarkable thing about the elk and all solid horned animals is that they shed their horns every year.

This starts with the horns and continues each year throughout its life. The size of the horns is governed by the age of the elk and its condition at the time the horns are being grown. An elk in its prime has the largest set of antlers.

As the elk grows old its horns are not so large or pretty as when the animal is younger. The number of points on the antler varies from the spike, as it is called, to those having seven and even eight points on a side. Those having more than six points on a side are generally broken.
