Attorney General Defends Action Against Strikers

Daugherty Says Government Used Injunction to Rescue Country From Grip of Civil War. Canton, O., Oct. 22.—Making his only campaign speech to the voters of his home state, Attorney General Daugherty gave an accounting of his stewardship at Washington, defended his course in the Chicago injunction proceedings and in the prosecution of war frauds and declared that despite "accusations and calumny," the Department of Justice would proceed to perform its duties as it sees them under the constitution.

Former Premier of Italy Supports Fascist Policy

Nitti and Mussolini, Formerly Enemies, Join in Effort to Save Nation From Difficult Situation. Rome, Oct. 22.—Former Premier Nitti made a notable speech to his constituents here Friday night which the politicians interpret as indicating his intention of seeking to head a ministry again. In fact, it is stated by well informed persons that Sig. Nitti has reached an agreement with Sig. Mussolini, head of the fascists, whereby the former will be premier and minister without portfolio and the latter minister of the interior in the next cabinet.

Railway Commission to Probe Stock Rates

Lincoln, Oct. 22.—(Special)—The state railway commission starts Monday on its investigation of livestock rates and their relation to the Missouri river markets outside the state. All the railroads and everybody else interested have been invited to tell their stories. This is an investigation taken on the initiative of the commission, and is part of the work of cooperation undertaken with the Interstate Commerce commission in ironing out rate tangles.

Lutheran Deacons Fined Under Reed-Norval Law

Lincoln, Oct. 22.—(Special)—Six deacons and members of the German Evangelical Lutheran church of Emerald, six miles west of Lincoln, were fined \$10 and costs in district court Saturday for promulgating and enforcing a decree that no services in English should be held in the church. The case is a test of the Reed-Norval law and the court was required on bond to await the disposal of their appeal in the supreme court.

Stockmen Are Entertained at Agricultural College

Lincoln, Oct. 22.—(Special)—Two hundred stockmen interested in the livestock industry spent yesterday at the agricultural college. Half came by auto and half by train. Many were entertained at the home economics department, after a drive about the city, while the other were directly to the farm, where they were shown cattle and discussed some special points put on by the students. They lunched at the farm restaurant, and attended the football game in the afternoon.

Oil Station Robbed
