

Jurors Dry Eyes, Women Weep, Girl Faints at Trial

Mother's Unselfish Testimony to Save Daughter Who Slew Husband and Stenographer Moves Court.

Philadelphia, Oct. 28.—From the reluctant lips of the mother of Mrs. Catherine Heller, on trial here for the murder of her husband's stenographer, Mildred Heckitt, came the indirect admission today that Catherine had been inevitable in her youth.

Mother Takes Stand. Mrs. Heller first took the stand in the morning, and told details of her life in order to save the life of her daughter.

The mother told of the strain of insanity that courses through the blood of her family, in order to substantiate the plea of emotional insanity offered by the girl.

Her father was crazy, Mrs. Heller testified, her sister insane, and her 5-year-old son is an imbecile, with the mind of a 3-year-old.

Before Catherine was born in 1900, Mrs. Heller said, her husband had been continually intoxicated and had brutally beaten and choked her.

Two jurors openly wiped their wet eyes with handkerchiefs. The trial stood still.

When the strain was able to speak Mrs. Heller told of having warned her daughter of Arthur Roser, brother of the slain man.

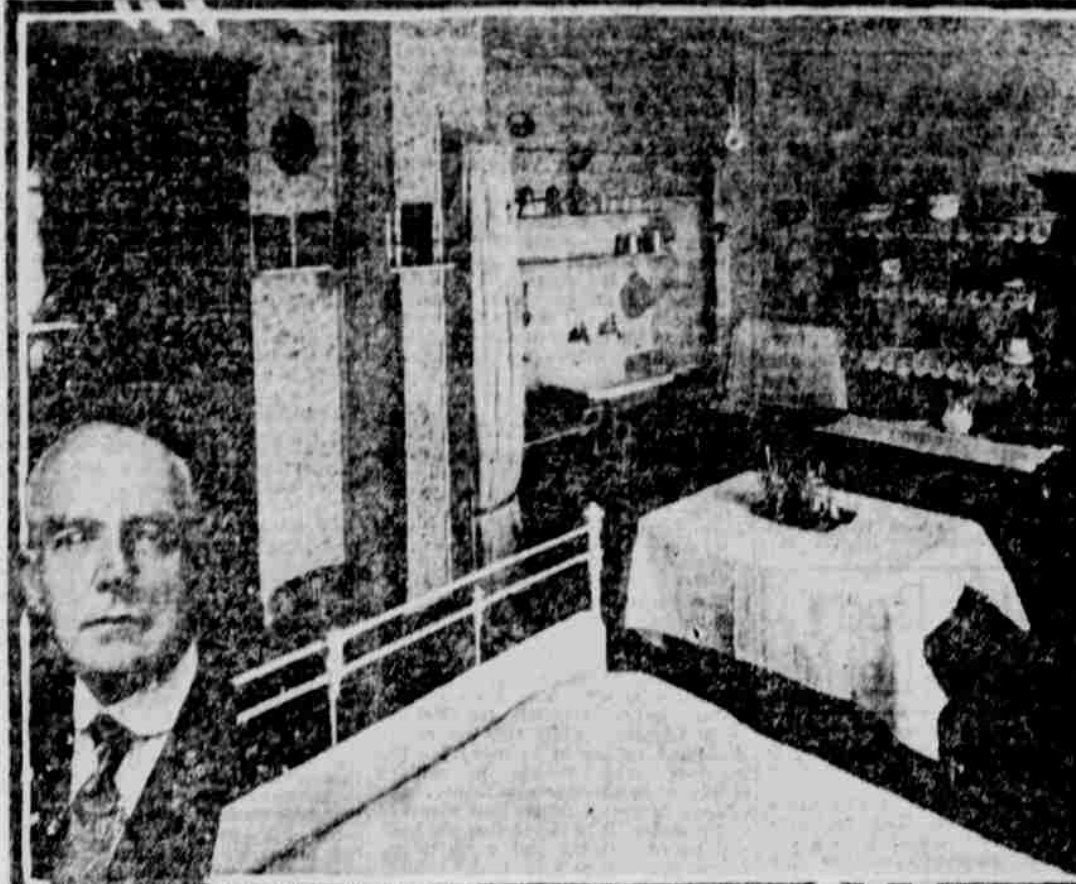
