

Coroner's Jury to Probe Woman's Death Under Car

Youth Arrested as Driver of Truck Is to Be Present at Inquest Today at 9.

Inquest into the death of Mrs. Margaret Hesel, who was killed at Twenty-fourth and Leavenworth streets Monday evening, will be conducted at Hoffman's morgue this morning at 9.

Deputy County Attorney Henry Deal, who will represent the state, said he will have several witnesses who are expected to give important testimony.

Jack Hellyer, 29, 1319 South Sixteenth street, who was arrested yesterday by Detectives Treglia and Lickert and held for investigation in connection with the accident, will be taken to the inquest. Detectives arrested Hellyer after they discovered blood in the box of the auto truck that he was repairing.

They allege that Hellyer confessed he was driving the truck that ran down Mrs. Hesel and that he sped away because he was scared.

Chief of Detectives Van Deusen, who quizzed Hellyer, says the youth told him that he wasn't going fast and that he struck the woman before he saw her.

Mrs. Hesel worked at the Florient cafe, Twenty-fourth and Leavenworth streets, and lived at 544 South Twenty-fourth street.
