

Thomas N. Page, Ex-Ambassador, Dies Suddenly

Member of Diplomatic Service Under Wilson and Prominent Author, Expires in South.

Richmond, Va., Nov. 1.—Thomas Nelson Page, former ambassador to Italy, and widely known author, died at the home of relatives in Hanover county, Virginia, today, according to a report received by the News Leader.

Mr. Page's death was sudden. The first intimation Richmond relatives had of his illness came this morning when they were called to the plantation where the former ambassador had gone for a rest. The only details received here was that the end came at 129.

Although he served as American ambassador at Rome for six years, Mr. Page was best known for his literary productions, which had made a name for him at home and abroad before President Wilson, at the beginning of his administration, asked him to enter the diplomatic service. He was appointed ambassador to Italy in June, 1913, and served in that capacity until August, 1919.

He was born April 13, 1853, in Hanover county. As a youth Mr. Page attended Washington and Lee university. In 1874 the degree of bachelor of laws was conferred on him by the University of Virginia. Subsequently the honorary degree of doctor of laws was conferred on him by Washington and Lee, Tulane university and William and Mary college and the degree of doctor of literature by Yale, Harvard and Washington and Lee.

Mr. Page was twice married—in 1884 to Miss Anne Seldon Bruce, who died in 1888, and in 1893 to Mrs. Florence Lathrop Field, widow of Henry Field of Chicago. Her death occurred last year.

Mr. Page was author of a number of books on southern life. Until recently Mr. Page had been making his home in Washington, but he closed his home there a few weeks ago with the intention of visiting relatives in Virginia and other states.

Mr. Page's services as ambassador to Italy covered a critical period in American European relations and many of the important diplomatic notes passing between the United States and the allied governments went through his hands.

Strike Shooting Aired in Court

Found Shotgun Under Hedge, Shells in Sewing Machine, According to Detective.

Mauro Trano, Missouri Pacific machinist, 2514 North Sixteenth street, was arraigned in central police court yesterday on a charge of shooting with intent to wound Joseph Vargo, 2429 North Sixteenth street, at 8:30 the night of September 22.

Vargo, who was out on strike, returned to work on orders from his union, he alleged, and was shot while in his back yard after, he alleges, Bruno and two others threatened to get him for returning to work.

Sixty-five shots from a shotgun pierced Vargo's body and he was in the hospital 17 days.

Detective English told of finding a shotgun under a hedge at 4940 North Sixteenth street, and shells corresponding with regular shells used in the shotgun in the drawer of a sewing machine at Bruno's home.

Bruno denied the shooting. His case was continued to November 19.
