

Berger Returned to U. S. Congress for Third Time

Wisconsin Socialist, Twice Refused Seat in House, Winner by Majority of About 6,000.

Milwaukee, Wis., Nov. 8.—By A. P.—Representative-elect Victor L. Berger, for the third time in Wisconsin's choice from the Fifth district. Twice elected to congress and both times refused his seat, Mr. Berger, following his defeat two years ago by William H. Stafford, republican, made a fourth campaign, turning the tables on Stafford by a majority which may exceed 6,000.

As leading socialist in Wisconsin, Mr. Berger's election came as the result of the quietest campaign his party has made in history of Wisconsin socialism. Repeal of the state prohibition enforcement law and adoption of a number of amendments to the state constitution to permit acquisition of property by the state were the two chief issues advanced in the socialist platform.

Returns from 197 out of 183 precincts gave Berger 21,158, Stafford 15,714. However, Mr. Berger does not consider his election a personal victory or a victory for the socialist party. Rather, he considers it the vindication of a party that "was the only one that before the war, since and during the war has stood fearlessly for party principles."

Beal Leads County Republican Ticket



Henry J. Beal, republican county attorney-elect, led the county republican ticket, polling 22,578 votes, against 17,883 cast for his democratic opponent, Lloyd Magney. Remarks have been heard on all sides that the Beal campaign was the cleanest conducted prior to the election.

Endres Wins Over Clark: Briggs and Curran Race Close

Ure Beaten by Bauman—25 Votes Separate Candidates for Commissioner in Fourth District.

Complete returns from Tuesday's election in Douglas county give M. L. Endres, incumbent county treasurer, an apparent lead of 400 votes over Sheriff Clark, candidate to succeed himself.

Complete unofficial returns reduced Curran's lead over Briggs for county commissioners of the Fourth district to 25 votes. It will take an official count to determine the result of this contest.

Henry Beal and Harry Peare, successful candidates for county attorney and register of deeds, respectively, received the highest votes in the county. Beal's victory over Magney was the most decisive of any of the county candidates.

Unofficial returns from 174 of 175 precincts of the county give Beal 25,578, and Magney 17,883.

On the board of education ticket the unofficial returns indicate that of the present seven members who sought reelection, Dr. F. W. Paulk, was the only one who lost out, and that Jennie M. Califfa will replace him. The six present members who were re-elected are: R. A. Van Orsdel, Max I. Walker, W. C. Ramsey, A. N. Eaton, John Bekins and D. C. Eldredge.

Against Charter Changes. Voters were against the four proposed city charter amendments.

R. B. Howell and C. M. Gruenther were re-elected directors of the Metropolitan Utilities district.

On the state senatorial delegation from Douglas county, Saunders, Robbins, Cooper and Chamber, republicans, have safe leads, while Cavanaugh in the Third senatorial district appears to have a small lead over Larkin.

Unofficial returns give the republicans eight of 13 state representatives in this county. Apparently the completion of the representative delegation will be: Republicans: Allan, Strehlow, Edward Smith, Belding, Dyball, Dycar, Baldrige, Timme, Democratic: Collins, Koutsky, Collins, Quinn and Elzasser.

One of the interesting features of the Howell-Hitchcock contest in Douglas county is the fact that more than a third of the Hitchcock lead over Howell was obtained in the Third and Fourth wards, lower wards of the city.

In the Third ward the vote was: Hitchcock, 2,090; Howell, 1,460. And in the Fourth: Hitchcock, 1,316; Howell, 849. Total for these two wards: Hitchcock, 2,405; Howell, 2,309.

Hitchcock's lead over Howell in Douglas was approximately \$900 on unofficial returns. The democratic senator, who failed of reelection, obtained more than one-third of his lead in Douglas county from only 25 of 175 voting precincts. In the Third and Fourth wards Hitchcock carried 20 out of 25 precincts.
