First State Interscholastic Tank Meet to Be Held Tonight

Indications are that the first annual Nebraska interscholastic swimming, diving and plunge championships will go off with a big splash at the Omaha Athletic club tonight.

Crack swimmers from six high schools—Tech, Central, South and Creighton, all of Omaha, and Grand Island and Lincoln—will compete.

The interscholastic events follow: 200-yard relay race, fancy diving, 50-yard free style, 50-yard breast stroke, 220-yard free style, plunge for distance, 100-yard backstroke and 100-yard free style.

The University of Iowa, the Omaha Athletic club, and the Grand Island Y. M. C. A. will be represented in the 50-yard open swim, which is being staged as an added feature.

A. B. Griffith will serve in the capacity of starter. Judges will be J. H. Beveridge, Robert H. Manley, Frank H. Myers and MacBaldridge.

A 50-yard swim for novice boys will be the curtain raiser. A 50-yard swim for novice girls between the ages of 19 and 13 is also on the program.
