

Late Returns Put California State in Dry Column

Errors in Tabulation and Late Returns Show Margin of 29,621 Votes in Favor of Eighteenth Amendment.

San Francisco, Nov. 11.—(By A. P.)—California, the leading wine grape growing state in the union and which once had hopes of competing with the champagne of France and the Rhine wines of Germany, has at last gone "dry" after 10 years of voting down prohibition measures.

A majority of 29,621 in favor of making the 18th amendment of the constitution of the United States and the Volstead act a statute law of California stood last night with only scattering precincts to be heard from, so that there appeared no possibility of the final total being against the enforcement of prohibition.

The vote last night was: For enforcement, 497,952; against, 278,331. A big majority against the measure at first appeared to have been cast in Tuesday's election, but this margin has been cut down steadily. At noon an error of about 24,000 votes was discovered in the office of the clerk of Alameda county, which reduced the anti-prohibition lead in that county to 2,242. Almost simultaneously other errors were discovered in the office of the register of Los Angeles county which served to increase the favorable majority there and this, with later additions to the Los Angeles totals, tipped the balance in favor of the act.

The new law provides for enforcement of the 18th amendment and the Volstead act by prosecuting attorneys, sheriffs, grand juries, magistrates and peace officers.

Bandits Steal Safe but Miss Big Payroll

St. Louis, Nov. 11.—A few minutes after five armed men had stolen a safe which they believed contained the \$60,000 payroll money of the American Car and Foundry company at St. Charles, 25 miles west of here, and had kidnaped the driver, A. J. Cault, the second wagon carrying the money, passed the place of the holdup.

The highwaymen fled in an automobile toward St. Louis, releasing the driver a few miles east of St. Charles. A check made later by the company officials, revealed the stolen safe contained not more than \$49. Because of the celebration of Armistice day planned for Saturday, the company had deviated from its customary hour of delivering the money, thus saving the payroll.

Two Prisoners Are Killed in Attempted Jail Break Birmingham, Ala., Nov. 11.—Two prisoners were shot and killed, one was probably fatally injured and two others slightly injured when they attempted to escape through a mine shaft at Flat Top prison camp, near here, early last night.

Hurt in Airplane Wreck. Houston, Tex., Nov. 11.—Mrs. Ben D. Jackson, wife of the president of the South Texas Fair association, and R. E. Barry, aviator of Brooklyn, N. Y., were seriously injured when the plane in which they were riding at the Beaumont fair, crashed yesterday. It was reported here. Internal injuries are feared.

West Virginian Is Disfranchised for Three Years

Defeated Candidate in Primaries Convicted Under State Corrupt Practices Act—Fined \$1,000.

Huntington, W. Va., Nov. 11.—Political history in West Virginia was written yesterday when C. Fred Edwards, millionaire Huntington mattress manufacturer and defeated candidate for the republican nomination for United States senator in the August primaries, was sentenced to pay a fine of \$1,000 costs and deprived of his right to vote for the next three years.

Judge D. E. Matthews, lifelong friend, who recalled Edwards' "Horatio Alger" like rise in the world from a barefoot boy to one of the leading manufacturers of this district, imposed sentence on two indictments when Edwards pleaded "nolo contendere." One charged him with being one day late in returning his sworn post statement of campaign expenditures to the secretary of state. On this he was fined \$1,000.

The other charge grew out of Edwards' campaign expenditures. He was indicted for having distributed \$37,500 in this county alone as a part of the \$36,000 he expended in the state. The West Virginia corrupt practices, under which charges were returned, limits expenditures to \$75 a county, or \$4,125 for the entire commonwealth. On this count he was disfranchised for three years.

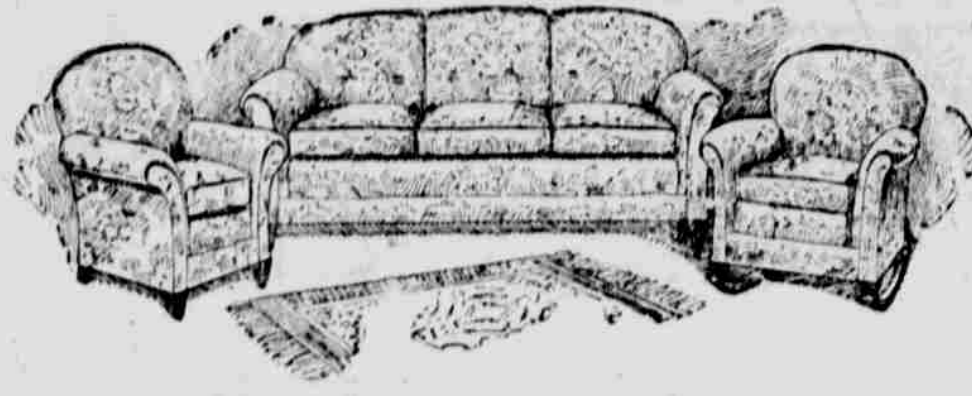

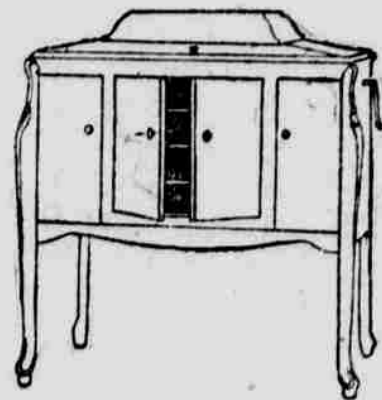

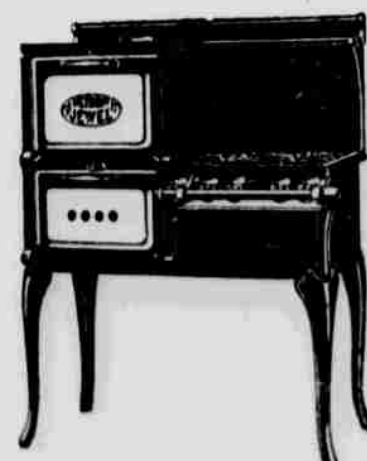
