Czecho-Slovak Bishop Is Guest in Omaha

Bishop Gorazd Pavlik of the Czecho-Slovak National Orthodox church, spent Wednesday in Omaha as the guest of Stanley Serpan, Czecho-Slovak vice consul. He visited with Charles Joseph Koukol, minister of the Bohemian Presbyterian church.

Bishop Pavlik is touring the United States in the interests of the newly formed church of Czecho-Slovakia. The National Orthodox church has broken away from the Roman Catholic church, the bishop stated. "The local ones," he said, "when we were refused the right to use the Czech language, instead of the Latin in our religious services."

Bishop Pavlik headed a delegation to the nation in 1919, the petition the pope to grant desired reforms. He left last evening for Kansas City, but will return to Omaha next Monday night to speak in Trinity cathedral.
