

### Senate Will Vote on Proposed Loan to Liberia Monday

Senator Norris Opposes Administration Plan in Caustic Speech on Stand of Country in War.

Washington, Nov. 24.—Agreement was reached in the senate for a final vote Monday on the administration measure to loan Liberia \$5,000,000. The senate then adjourned until Monday.

Attack on the proposed loan by the democrats was general. They ridiculed the republican claim that a moral obligation existed to Liberia for its part played in the world war. Administration leaders, in reply, declared the previous democratic administration had arranged to extend the loan, but had delayed carrying it out until Liberia complied with certain conditions.

Senator Norris, republican, Nebraska, came to the aid of the opposition with a caustic speech, in which he pictured the people of the United States and the allied nations waiting anxiously during the war to see in what side Liberia would take. He declared that when Liberia finally decided to join America and the allies "the foundations of the imperial German government quivered and the latter turned from a dark brunette to a pale blonde."

Continuing, the Nebraska senator said that "in the great world war the flag of the Liberian government never saw defeat and not a single Liberian soldier or sailor was taken prisoner." Liberia even after the war, the senator added, continued on its patriotic way, sending "a delegation of statesmen to the peace conference at the expense of the United States government, and there supported President Wilson in his advocacy of a league of nations."

### Plans for Steel Merger Completed

Bethlehem to Absorb Midvale Company—Purchase Price Given as \$97,650,000.

New York, Nov. 24.—Completion of the negotiations for the absorption of the Midvale Steel & Ordnance Co. by the Bethlehem Steel Co. was announced tonight by President E. G. Grace of the Bethlehem company.

This acquisition will give the Bethlehem concerns an annual ingot capacity of 7,600,000 tons. At the same time announcement was made by W. E. Corey, chairman of the board of the Midvale Steel & Ordnance Co., of approval by the directors of contracts for the sale of the assets and properties of that company and of the Cambria Steel Co., owned by the Midvale company, to the Bethlehem Steel corporation, and the Bethlehem Steel Co. to the Bethlehem Steel corporation.

The contract, negotiated by Presidents Corey and Grace, calls for a purchase price of \$97,650,000, which will be paid in common stock of the Bethlehem company. Mr. Corey will retire as head of the Midvale Corporation but will be represented on the board of directors of the Bethlehem Steel corporation.

Mr. Grace said the purchase had received a clean bill of health from Attorney General Daugherty but that opposition was anticipated from the federal trade commission, as was the case when the Lackawanna Steel Co. was taken over by the Bethlehem interests.
