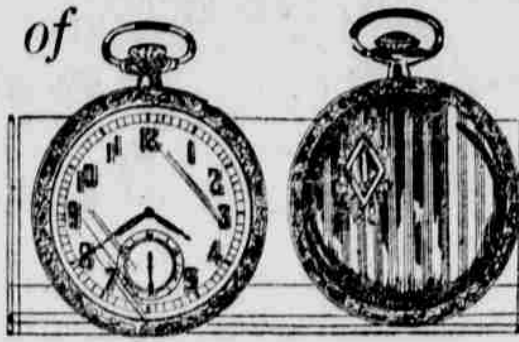

### Two Men Held for Assaulting Girls

Victim Testifies Her Clothes Were Torn Off Before She Leaped From Auto.

Ed Dwyer, 1708 Davenport street, and Ed Melvin, 4611 North Twenty-second street, were bound over to district court for trial from police court yesterday, charged with attempting to assault Ida Bernstein, 17, 2020 North Twenty-second street, and her chum, Sarah Louis, 17, 2526 Decatur street.

Both men pleaded not guilty to the charge. The Bernstein girl testified against the two, declaring they tore her clothes before she leaped from the car. The Louis girl is still in the hospital, recovering from injuries received when she fell from the automobile.

Ida Bernstein testified the men pushed Sarah from the automobile. The men denied they pushed the girl from their car. Vern Bruce, 4921 North Thirty-sixth street, alleged to have been the third man in the machine is being held on a \$100 bond as a state's witness.

Dwyer's bond was fixed at \$1,500. It was made \$500 less than that of Melvin, because Dwyer testified he supports his mother. The affair occurred Monday night at Eighteenth and Davenport streets. The two girls had accepted a "ride home" from the Roseland dance hall.
