Commission Opposes New River Rail Rates

Lincoln, Nov. 29.—Opposing any readjustment of class rates on freight shipments in the Missouri river territory which allows reductions from Kansas City, St. Joseph, Atchison and Leavenworth to points in Nebraska, without simultaneous action to reduce the tariffs from Lincoln, Omaha and other Nebraska shipping centers to the same points, the state railway commission has asked the Interstate Commerce commission to suspend rates schedules which the railroads have published to become effective December 5.

Such a reduction for lower Missouri river cities without a corresponding reduction in upper Missouri river territory would give an undue advantage to Missouri and Kansas manufacturers and jobbers at the expense of Nebraska, the commission claims.

Men Convicted of Syndicalism Freed by Small

Illinois Governor Commutes Sentences of William Bross Lloyd and 16 Associates.

Springfield, Ill., Nov. 29.—(By A. P.)—Sentences of William Bross Lloyd and 16 associates, serving sentences in Joliet prison and the Cook county jail, for violation of the state anti-syndicalism law, today were commuted to expire at once by Governor Len Small.

In taking this action Governor Small announced he was in full accord with the dissenting opinion of Justice Carter of the supreme court, who, contrary to the majority opinion, questioned the constitutionality of the syndicalism law, when the court decided the men must serve their sentences.
