Chicago, Dec. 6.—(By A. P.)—Gen. John J. Pershing wound up a busy day in Chicago tonight by sending broadcast through the air a demand for suppression of radicals and a plea for more patriotism and a strong army to defend the United States.

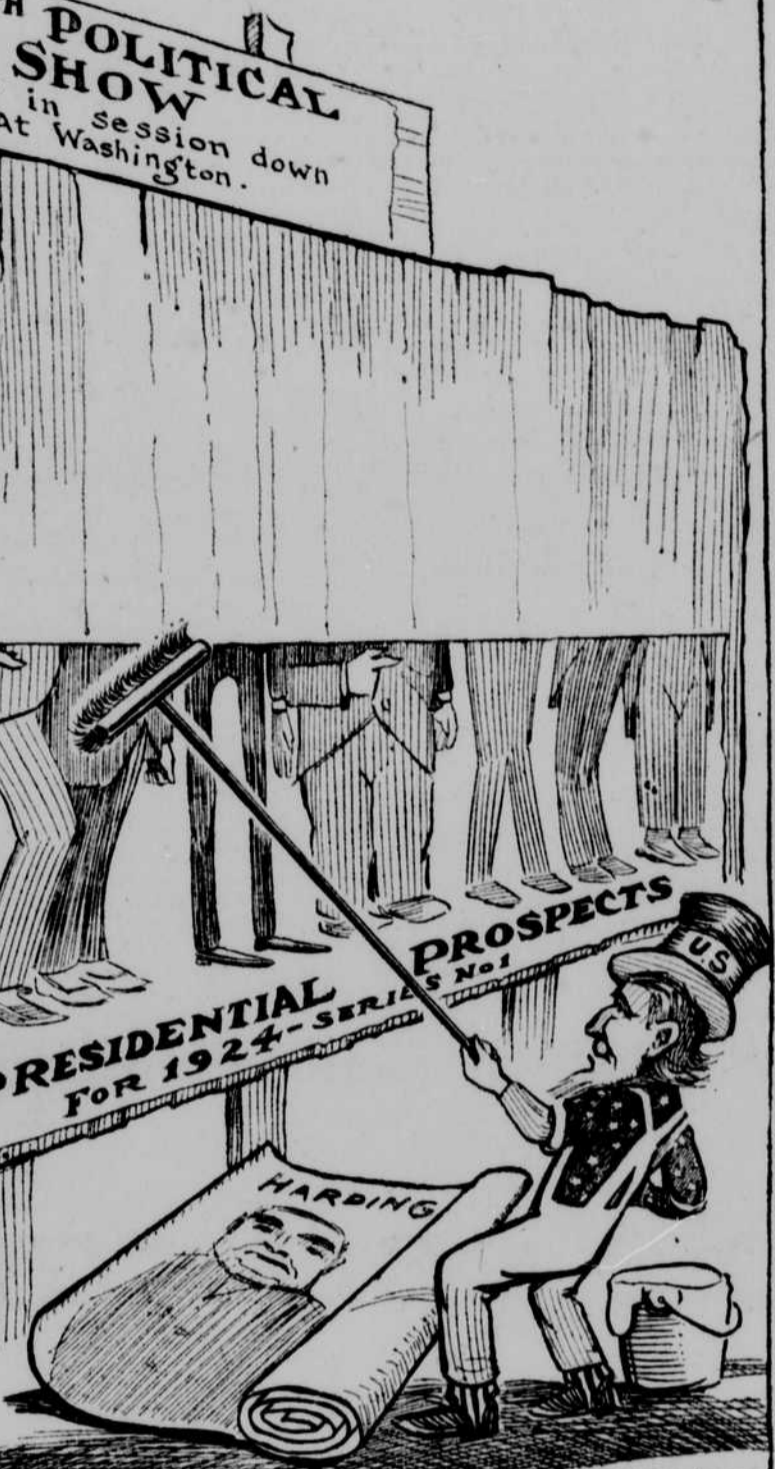
