How to Piay Basketball.

Offense. A number of plays from center will now be given. You can try them all out, and select the ones your team can play to best advantage. First, is the one where the center "taps" off to the left forward comes in fast turns to the inside and passes the ball to the right forward, who, after having made a fake start forward, has reversed and turns to the inside and passes the ball to for the basket. The center, after making his "tap." passes through the right forward, has reversed and to the right forward has taken a shot, to follow it up with him. On the "tap" to the right forward, the positions are reversed.
