Wichita Falls, Tex., Jan. 11.-An other chapter was added to the varied career of Henry Toussaint, former officer in the United States army self-made man and convicted slaver. as authorities searched for him early today following his escape yesterday

from the county jail. Toussaint was sentenced to death after he was convicted of charges he killed his father, who was 69 years

At 9:20, o'clock last night he was in his cell. At 10:15 he was gone but the four doors between him and freedom were still locked.


