

Board of Trade Will Broadcast Current Prices

Half Hour Service From Chicago During Trading Hours Announced—Will Start Today.

Chicago, Jan. 11.—The Chicago board of trade today purchased the big radio broadcasting station "WDIP," located on top of the Drake hotel, and Friday will begin sending grain quotations every 30 minutes during trading hours on market days.

The board of trade has furnished quotations to a local broadcasting station for several months, but under the new plan will give a much more extended service to farmers throughout the middle west.

"In this manner we shall give to the entire radio public official prices and other valuable information in connection with all commodities handled through the board of trade, thus serving the purpose from the farmer to the consumer. We hope to broaden our acquaintance and demonstrate our proclamation that the Chicago board of trade is an open book that he who runs may read and that prices are not made behind closed doors and available only to the few."

Nothing but authoritative facts and figures will be broadcast on the commercial side, but we hope to enter the more human side of life through concerts, as well as instructive addresses.

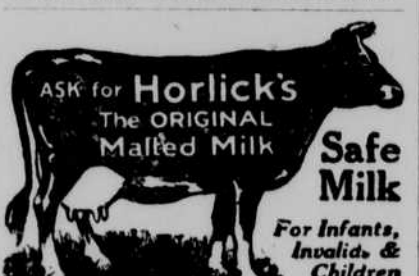
Reports Indicate Increase in Number of Spring Pigs

Alma, Neb., Jan. 12.—(Special)—The Southwestern Nebraska Poultry association will close its fourth annual show Saturday night. Seventy-five exhibitors are registered with a showing of 700 birds, some being brought from Pierre, Columbus, Omaha and Kansas. The following statement was given by Erle B. Smiley,

Judge of the show for its four seasons: "The exhibit is second to none in the state outside of Omaha and the state fair. A greater interest is shown by exhibitors and a larger number of spectators attend than any other show in the state." A number of the birds shown will be sent to Madison Square Garden, New York.

Sharp Decrease in Crime Reported in Windy City Chicago, Jan. 12.—Chicago has the

best police administration in its history under Charles Fitzmorris, general superintendent of police, and crime has decreased from 30 to 66 per cent. Edwin W. Sims, president of the Chicago crime commission, declared last night in his fourth annual report. While murders, burglary, robbery and automobile thefts have decreased, convictions have increased, he said. During the last year the number of stolen automobiles recovered increased 20 per cent.
