Y. M. C. A. Plans to Launch Annual Campaign Feb. 5

Local Association Seeks to Raise \$75,000 in Drive-**Budget for Year Placed** at \$118,000.

Announcement of the Y. M. C. A.'s annual drive for funds, to be launched February 5, was made Monday night by the directors of the organiza-

The local association seeks this year to raise \$75,000, it was explained; \$31, 000 for the work of the institution the year ending December 31, 1923, \$19,000 for payment of current bills past due, \$20,000 for an accumulated deficit of the last few years and \$5,000 for Omaha's share of the state work

Budget of the association in Oma-ha for 1923 will be \$118,000 or approximately \$17,000 less than the actual expenses of the association in 1921. Of the amount required, \$88,000 will be realized from the activities of the association

G. W. Noble, president of the Omaha Young Men's Christian association, will be in charge of the campaign aided by J. Dean Ringer, chairman of the state committe. The as-sociation also will have the services of George L. Goodwin, national assoclation finance director.

The campaign will continue until February 12




